





BUILDING OUR TOMORROW ON YESTERDAY'S FOUNDATION FBC Pledge Campaign for Renovation Project Update



Phase One of our renovation project is complete, and the windows in the educational building are BEAUTIFUL. We anticipate that the kitchen renovation will soon begin and are so excited about what's to come in one of the most used areas of the church.

As we faithfully give to the Lord through this project, God will bless our faithfulness. The renovation project includes: replacing windows in the educational building, updating the kitchen facilities, adding audiovisual equipment and sound enhancements to the fellowship hall, and painting/repairing wood around the stained-glass windows in the sanctuary and installing new protective coverings over them. The total cost of these projects is estimated to be \$300,000. Through the pledge campaign, we are confident that we can retire this debt in five (5) years or less.
